SPACEFAIR '83

AAAP is planning to conduct a "SPACEFAIR" at Quakerbridge Mall as part of its public relations program.

The SPACEFAIR would consist of a series of educational exhibits prepared by AAAP and, potentially, other area institutions, such as the NJ State Planetarium, Princeton University's Astronomy Department, the Institute for Advanced Studies, and the Space Studies Institute.

The purpose of this event would be to familiarize the general public with AAAP's existence as well as the importance of space science and technology to humanity. The fair could be timed to coincide with the onset of Spring 1983 observing sessions. Furthermore, our exhibit would enable us to participate in various area community fairs in the future.
